

#### **About Our Site-Bowfort Area**

Camp Chief Hector YMCA is located in Bow Valley Provincial Park in Exshaw, AB. We are fortunate to have access to over 1000 acres of land to explore, learn, and play together outside in nature.

Bowfort Area hosts our Juniors program and our Day Camp Program in the summer season. Campers will stay in tipis or indoor cabin accommodations. Our dining hall is located in Bowfort Lodge surrounded by activity areas including archery and Bowfort Waterfront.



#### **About Our Site- Hector Area**

Hector area is the home base for all Summer Camp Programs aged 10+. The dining hall is located inside Hector Lodge, which is surrounded by the yurts assigned to Mistaya and Kananaskin Campers. Around this area includes our archery range, challenge course, climbing tower, and is steps away from Hector Waterfront and our barn.

Halfway between Bowfort Area and Hector Area is our Expedition Centre and Midcamp Area. This is where our Pioneer, Wrangler in Training, and all Leadership/LIT programs stay during their time here at camp.

**Activity Blocks** allow campers to participate as their tipi/yurt group in the listed programs. Campers will have these times to develop teamwork, build friendships and create memories together at these program areas.

**Section Activity** is a time for campers to gather with all groups in their age group. An activity will be facilitated during this time which could be a sing-a-long campfire or a large game such as capture the flag. It's a time to gather and connect with other campers their age to expand their community.

**Freebies** are a time where your camper is able to sign up to attend a program area they enjoyed the most so they can experience it again! They will join other campers with the same interest and get to focus on what they loved to do the most.



#### **Summer Day Camps**

6-10 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2025.
All Gender Groups

Day Camp sessions run 5 days, Monday to Friday including running on holidays including Canada Day and the August Civic Holiday. Campers receive a lunch in Bowfort Lodge alongside our Junior campers to fuel them as they participate in a fun-filled day! Day camp programs include archery, canoeing, classic camp games, rock climbing, and a visit to our horses. Day campers work as a team to experience new activities and face challenges with the guidance of their camp counsellor.

Bussing is available from CANMORE and EXSHAW at no additional cost. Our site is in the Bow Valley, approximately 55 minutes west of Calgary.







# 6 Day Programs OVERNIGHT CAMPS

## **JUNIORS**

7-9 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

#### **Acommodations: Cabins or Tipis**

The Junior program is based out of Bowfort Lodge. Junior campers come for 6 days, 5 nights and stay in either a tipi or cabin, to be selected at time of registration. Campers will experience many camp activities that include archery, rock climbing, canoeing, classic camp games and get to visit the horses. All campers have the option to try an onsite overnight camping experience with their group. All Junior campers will develop their teamwork skills, experience new challenges and meet new friends.

Please note: this program has changed from 2024 and will no longer include an onsite overnight camping trip.

## **MISTAYA**

10 - 11 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

#### **Accomodations: Yurts**

Mistaya camp offers time for learning, making friends, working as a team and having fun outdoors! During this 6-day program, campers will participate in activities such as hiking on our trails, arts and crafts, rock climbing, archery and classic camp games! All 6-day Mistaya campers have the option to participate in an onsite one night overnight camping experience. All Mistaya camps run out of Hector Lodge and campers will stay in yurts.

This program is an introductory level program for those campers new to camp between the ages of 10-11 years.

Please note: this program has changed from 2024 and will no longer include an onsite overnight camping trip.

### **KANANASKIN**

12-13 YEARS Campers must turn this age by December 31, 2026.

#### **Acommodations: Yurts**

Kananaskin camp offers a time for learning, making friends, working as a team, and having fun outdoors! In this 6-day program, campers will participate in activities such as hiking on our trails, arts and crafts, high ropes, archery, and classic camp games! All 6-day Kananaskin campers have the option to participate in an onsite one night overnight camping experience. All Kananaskin camps are run out of Hector Lodge and campers will stay in yurts.

This program is an introductory level program for those campers new to camp between the ages of 12 - 13 years.

Please note: this program has changed from 2024 and will no longer include an onsite overnight camping trip.

# **PIONEER**

14-15 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

#### **Acommodations: Yurts**

Pioneer Camp offers a time for learning, making friends, working as a team, and having fun outdoors! During their 6 days here, Pioneer campers will participate in activities such as a day hike, high ropes, archery, classic camp games, and canoeing! All Pioneer 6D campers will participate in a one night onsite overnight camping experience. All Pioneer camps are run out of Hector Lodge and the campers will stay in yurts in Midcamp with other Pioneer programs.

This program is an introductory level program for those campers new to camp between the ages of 14-15 years.

**OVERNIGHT CAMPS** 

#### **MISTAYA**

10-11 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

Mistaya campers come to camp for a 13-day session and live in yurts near Hector Lodge. Campers will participate in various traditional camp activities including archery, rock climbing, arts and crafts and canoeing all while developing their teamwork and self-confidence. Each camper will get the opportunity to visit the barn and learn about the horses.

Each 13-day Mistaya camper will experience a 3-day overnight hike at a local campsite. During this adventure, campers will help pack and carry their gear and food, help set up their campsite and work as a team to learn and have fun in the outdoors!



## **KANANASKIN**

12-13 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

Kananaskin campers come to camp for a 13-day session and live in yurts near Hector Lodge. Campers participate in various traditional camp activities including archery, rock climbing, and arts and crafts while building their team, and developing their personal skills. Each camper will have the opportunity to visit the horses and learn introductory horsemanship and riding skills.

These campers will prepare for their 4-day overnight trip by first doing skill building onsite either hiking or canoeing (river based). During the overnight expedition adventures, campers will help pack and carry their gear and food, help set up their campsite and work as a team to learn and have fun.

This program has FOCUSES for their expeditions.
Onsite programming is the same for both groups.
At the time of registration, you will have to choose CANOE or HIKE.

## PIONEER - HIKE [All Gender]

14-15 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026. Accomodations: Yurts

Pioneer hike campers come to camp for a 13-day session and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Campers will learn about teamwork, leadership, responsibility, and develop personal strengths and self-confidence. Campers will participate in a variety of camp activities such as games, arts and crafts, archery, climbing and more.

These campers will participate in 8 days (total) of hiking. These 8 days are broken down into a day trip, and the longer backcountry expedition. These experiences give opportunities for campers to focus on developing leadership and outdoor living skills, as well as backcountry travel.

## PIONEER - CANOE [All Gender]

14-15 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

Pioneer canoe campers come to camp for a 13-day session and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Campers will learn about teamwork, leadership, responsibility, and develop personal strengths and self-confidence. Campers will participate in a variety of camp activities such as games, arts and crafts, archery, climbing and more.

These campers will participate in 8 days (total) of canoeing. These 8 days are broken down into a day trip, and the longer backcountry expedition. These experiences give opportunities for campers to focus on developing leadership and outdoor living skills, as well as backcountry travel.

# WRANGLER IN TRAINING [All Gender]

14-15 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodation: Yurts** 

Our Wrangler in Training Program is an equine and leadership focused program. In this two week program, campers will spend the majority of their time involved in activities at the barn where they will gain a rich experience with horses involving developing horsemanship and horseback riding skills. Campers will also participate in camp activities, a day hike, and classic camp games!

They will experience daily life at the barn and have leadership opportunities with the younger groups on site. Wranglers in Training is suitable for all levels of experience.

### **LEADERSHIP- Canoe** [All Gender]


16 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

Leadership campers come to camp for 27 days and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Their focus will be on learning and developing backcountry expedition skills and leadership abilities. To facilitate their development in these areas, campers will participate in various outdoor expedition trips, including onsite overnights and canoe practice training prior to the expedition.

Included in this program are over 16 nights of backcountry canoe tripping experience. Groups plan and prepare together for their exciting and rewarding expedition trips with their leaders. Throughout their month-long experience, they will develop personal strengths and new abilities.







# **LEADERSHIP- Horse & Hike** [All Gender]

16 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

This program is \*\*NEW\*\* to 2026 and is suited for those looking to develop their outdoor leadership skills and horsemanship skills. Half of the program will be focused on time at the barn learning from our Wranglers about horsemanship, horseback riding, and participating in a horsebased overnight pack trip expedition.

The other half of the program will be focused on building leadership skills during onsite activities including high ropes and canoeing. Campers will also participate in a 6 day hiking expedition in the backcountry to practice these skills and continue to develop their outdoor literacy and leadership skills.

16 YEARS CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

Leadership campers come to camp for 27 days and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Their focus will be on learning and developing backcountry expedition skills and leadership abilities. To facilitate their development in these areas, campers will participate in various outdoor expedition trips, including onsite overnights and day trips.

Included in this program are over 16 nights of backcountry hiking trip experience. Groups plan and prepare together for their exciting and rewarding expedition trips with their leaders. Throughout their monthlong experience, they will develop personal strengths and new abilities.





## **LEADERSHIP- Exchange** [All Gender]

**16 YEARS** CAMPERS MUST TURN THIS AGE BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2026.

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

This will be the third year of this new Leadership Exchange Program! This program is a new 27 day program that we are running in conjunction with YMCA Camp Pine Crest located in Muskoka, Ontario

This program will focus on the development of leadership skills through an exchange trip to Camp Pine Crest YMCA. At this camp, the CCHY campers join the Pine Crest Cohort and participate in their camp activities as well as a 4-5 day canoe trip on the French River. After their 10 days at Camp Pinecrest YMCA, their cohort and the CCHY campers will return to CCHY for 10 days together on our site. During their time, CCHY campers will host the Pine Crest cohort and be leaders and ambassadors for all things CCHY. They will participate in our trek course, classic CCHY programming and go on a 4-5 day hiking expedition in the Bow Valley.

All travel associated with the exchange program is included in the program fee.

# LEADER IN TRAINING [All Gender]

17 YEARS

**Accomodations: Yurts** 

Registration for the Leaders-in-Training (LIT) program involves an application and interview process that is open to past Leadership participants and other interested youths. LIT is a month-long program during which they will participate in leadership training, a backpacking trip, and activities to develop their leadership skills.

The second two weeks is reserved for the LIT's to volunteer as a counsellor for a Juniors or Mistaya group. This program is focused on building leadership skills and gaining experience being a counsellor. This program includes a 3 day offsite expedition aimed to build outdoor leadership skills.

This program is \*\*NEW\*\* to 2026. Great Divide Hike campers come to camp for 55 days and live in a Yurt near Deer Lodge. The focus of this program is on honing outdoor leadership skills on a 40-day backpacking trip on the Great Divide Trail. Great Divide Hike campers will be immersed in a team environment, allowing them to explore the ways in which they can contribute to a common goal and group identity.

Campers will become a part of the planning and preparation process for the wilderness expedition by contributing toward food and gear packing as well as developing individual and group goals for the expedition. Part of this program will be focused on performing community service and trail maintenance on the Great Divide trail in order to contribute to the longevity of the program.

On the wilderness expedition, campers will have the opportunity to hone their skills as outdoor leaders by taking on peer-leadership roles, such as navigation, route planning, camp craft, and cooking. Throughout the Great Divide Hike, campers will develop their personal strengths, learn new skills, and recognize areas of growth.



#### TRANSPORTATION FOR CAMP

#### **OVERNIGHT CAMPS**

Camp Chief Hector YMCA has two options for campers to get to and from camp for their overnight program. They can catch a bus at Shane Homes at Rocky Ridge YMCA or can be dropped off by personal vehicle to site. The bus option does not have a fee associated with it.

Camper forms are distributed by email to families in late Spring. On these forms you are able to indicate how you would like your camper to get to and from camp.

#### **DAY CAMPS**

Camp Chief Hector YMCA has two options for campers to get to and from camp for their day camp program. You may drop off and pick up your child daily directly on site, or use the bus that drops off in Exshaw and Canmore only.

There are not options for a bus from Calgary for day camp programs.

#### **CANCELLATION POLICY**

- Cancellations less than 60 days before the program start date are charged a 25% cancellation fee
- Cancellations less than 14 days before the program start date will be charged the full camp fee
- Medical cancellations will receive a refund with a valid note from your primary health care provider
- Cancellations due to illness, on the first day of program or after, will be pro-rated refund from the time of the cancellation
- Refunds will not be issued where a camper is removed from the camp program at the choice or request of the camper or parent(s)/guardian(s), or because of not following the camper code of conduct for behaviour or camp rules
- Should we not be able to offer day camps safely under government restrictions, refunds and payment options will be provided
- Cancellations prior to 60 days before the first date of the session receive a full refund with no fee or penalty

#### **INCLUSION & SUPPORT**

At Camp Chief Hector YMCA, we strive to create a space for all individuals to belong, grow, thrive and lead.

While CCHY cannot provide 1:1 support for individual's behavioural needs, we are able to provide other support systems and allow external support workers to attend with your camper. Learn more about our staffing structure and available supports on our staffing pages.

# HOW DOES STAFFING WORK AT CAMP CHIEF HECTOR YMCA?

In our summer camp programs, we aim to provide a two counsellor to eight camper ratio with our minimum supervision ratio being one counsellor to eight campers. In addition to counsellors, we have a variety of other camp staff supporting campers, including:

- Resource staff (who have a specific skill set for facilitating in specialized areas, such as canoeing, arts and crafts, horse programs, the Wellness Centre and the Expedition Centre)
- Team Leads (who provide leadership and program oversight of each age division)
- Coordinators (who provide leadership and supervision of our large program areas, including Bowfort Lodge, Hector Lodge, the Barn, the Wellness Centre, and the Expedition Centre)

#### **TRAINING**

All of our staff go through a background check and receive extensive Child Protection and Safeguarding, and Risk Managment training. All of our staff are required to be certified in Standard First Aid and CPR Level C.

For all of our programs, we prioritize our staffing based on individual's qualifications, skills and certifications including but not limited to Wilderness Advanced First Aid and Canoeing certifications from Paddle Canada.

In some instances, the staff assigned to your camper's group may be a different gender. All of our staff are trained equally and our policies for child safety are the same regardless of the staff's gender.
